Swimmer's Itch Reminder

Here are a few tips to avoid swimmer's itch:

- You are more likely to get swimmer's itch during the beginning of the season.
- Try to avoid it by swimming in deep water rather than shallow.
- Leave the water immediately & hose off.
- Rub visible skin vigorously with a towel.

Hutchins Lake Boating Laws

(From the current Handbook of Michigan Boating Laws and Responsibilities, 2016 Edition)

Please post these boating laws and regulations in your lake home. Take time to discuss them with your family, guests, and renters. Report violations to the Allegan County Marine Patrol 269-673-0438. In an emergency dial 911.

- Non-motorized craft, i.e. sailboats, rowboats, canoes, and kayaks, etc. have the right of way over powered watercraft (boats & PWC). Skiers must also yield right of way to non-motorized craft.
- Operating powered watercraft, including personal watercraft (PWC) such as Jet Skis, Ski-Doos, Wave Runners, etc. at speeds which create a wake is restricted to the hours of 11:00 am to 7:30 pm daily.
- Personal watercraft (PWC) may not cross a wake within 150 feet of another vessel.
- All powered watercraft must stay 100 feet, and preferably more, from fishing boats, sailing boats, swimming areas, docks, boat floats, buoys, rafts, and inhabited shores.
- All powered watercraft, including those pulling skiers, must travel in a counter-clockwise direction around the lake.
- No powered watercraft may be operated in a reckless manner which endangers life, limb, or property.
- All powered watercraft (boats and PWC) must have a legal operator and at least one competent observer (no dogs or children) to tow or pull water skiers, tubes, rafts, etc.
- Persons less than 14 years of age may not legally operate a personal watercraft (PWC).
- Persons 14 and 15 years of age may operate a PWC legally only if they have obtained a boating safety certificate and ...
 - He or she is accompanied on board by his or her parent or legal guardian or by a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian or ...
 - He or she is operating or riding the PWC at a distance of not more than 100 feet from his or her parent or legal guardian or from a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian.
- Persons at least 16 years of age and born after December 31, 1978, may operate a PWC legally only if they
 have obtained a boating safety certificate.
- Those born on or before December 31, 1978, may operate a PWC legally without restrictions.
- Persons less than 12 years of age may operate a boat powered by a motor of no more than 6 horsepower (hp) legally without restrictions.
- **Persons less than 12 years of age** may operate a boat powered by a motor of more than 6 hp but no more than 35 hp legally **only if** they:
 - Have been issued a boating safety certificate and have it on board the boat and ...
 - Are directly supervised on board by a person at least 16 years of age.
- Persons less than 12 years of age may not operate a boat powered by a motor of more than 35 hp legally
 under any conditions.
- **Persons born on or after July 1, 1996**, may operate a boat legally **only if** they have been issued a boating safety certificate and have it on board the boat.
- Person born before July 1, 1996, may operate a boat legally without restrictions.
- A vessel operator who is required to have passed a boating safety course should carry this certificate on board.

These laws are listed in the Marine Safety Act. All boating laws and regulations will be enforced by the Marine Patrol of the Allegan County Sheriff's Department. There will be frequent patrols. Violators will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.

All Waterfowl Are To Be Left Alone

All waterfowl on Hutchins Lake are to be left unmolested. Please avoid ...

- travelling through a group of waterfowl
- chasing them
- getting close to them
- bothering their nesting areas
- separating babies from their parents

Please obey all boating laws on Hutchins Lake for the safety of the people and waterfowl that enjoy this beautiful lake. Please inform your guests/renters what acceptable and lawful behavior is on Hutchins Lake.

2017 Summer Discovery Days

Discovery Days for children K-3rd grade will take place July 11th & 12th from 9 am until noon with the 13th a makeup day. The class is FREE, covers both days, and is limited to 10-12 students. A picnic for students and their families will follow after class on the second day.

The theme of class instruction will be the life cycle of a dragon fly, a sun fish, and a frog in and around Hutchins Lake. Also, invasive species that negatively affect the lake will be studied. Students will make a nature board reflecting these themes.

Class activities will include a tour of the lake scouting wildlife via a pontoon boat, learning about water clarity and how it is measured, & reviewing boating rules. A certified life jacket is required.
